Hello Future Kiewit Colts,

You will soon be receiving a letter in the mail welcoming you to KMS and assigning your child's math placement for next fall...so what does it mean? Well, for those new to the middle school scene let me explain. We offer three levels of math in sixth grade. Integrated Math I (formerly – Math 6) is our grade level course. These are students that are “on grade level” in math ability. Students with Integrated Math II (formerly –Challenge Math 6) placements are actually taking our seventh grade math class in sixth grade, so they are one-year above grade level in math ability. Finally, those placed in Integrated Math III (formerly – Pre-algebra) are taking the eighth grade course and are two-years above grade level in their math ability. If you attend our meeting on **May 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM** at Kiewit, we will go into further details about the courses and where your students goes from here.

I will be heading out to elementary schools starting on April 3<sup>rd</sup> and will wrap up visits the last week of April. When I come to visit, students will see an information video about Kiewit. We will talk about what a middle school day looks like, hand out curriculum handbooks, and talk about registration. Registration involves a few simple choices, which will be done by having the students access an IC survey on their student portal. A few clicks and word responses and submit....it is that easy!

Students will visit KMS on **May 5<sup>th</sup>** from Noon – 2:45 for our orientation day. Students from Aldrich will be bussed to Kiewit. Lunch will be served as part of the visit and will be paid for via the elementary school. Student's, who traditionally eat a sack lunch, may bring that with them on May 5<sup>th</sup>.

One last item before I wrap up. Later in April you should be receiving the Kiewit bi-monthly newsletter. If you are not, it may be because we do not have an updated email address for you or you do not have an email address. If you would like to receive a paper copy of this newsletter, please call KMS at 402-715-1470 to let us know. If you have questions about the transition to middle school, we hope to see you **May 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM** for a parent orientation meeting, but if you can't wait that long...call at 402-715-1470 and ask to talk to any of us:
